## **Informed Consent Form for Survey Participants**

### **Introduction and About the Study**

Hello. My name is \_\_\_\_\_ and I am coming from Sigma Research and Consulting, a research company in Bangalore. We are assisting the Centre for Public Policy at the Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore, in conducting a research study called “*In Her Name: Measuring the Gender Economic Gap - A pilot study to collect sex-disaggregated household economic data in Karnataka*”. The purpose of the study is to collect data on the economic conditions of men and women and measure the gap between them in this respect. We are also interested in understanding how major economic decisions in households are made and by whom.

We are collecting this data from 5000 households across 9 districts in Karnataka using this questionnaire (show the questionnaire to the participant at this point). You are being asked to take part in this study because you are a member of this community where we are conducting our study. ***Your village/area was selected for the study randomly and the selection of your household has also been completely random.*** This interview is expected to take 90 to 120 minutes and your participation in it depends entirely on your consent. We would also like to talk to one more adult member of your household.

### **Are there benefits to taking part in this study?**

Researchers, policy makers and the general public will learn from the knowledge gained in this study because such information is crucial to formulate, implement and monitor programmes aimed at promoting household and individual welfare. While the state government is aware of and has permitted this study to take place, we are not from the government or any government organization. No schemes or programmes are going to be formulated as a direct result of this study. After we analyse the data collected from you and all other households, we will come back to share the results of this study in your area. At that time, we will provide some information to help improve your and the community’s legal literacy and awareness. During and immediately after the interview, however, we will not be in a position to offer you any money or other tangible remuneration for the time that you spend giving this interview. Therefore, there are no direct and short-term benefits because of your participation in the study.

### **Risks/Discomforts**

You may face the following risks or discomforts by participating in this study:
